

Swimming Data 2024 - 2025

*Data below is for the current Year 6 classes that have attended weekly swimming during the Summer Term after SATs.
The data below is reflective from June 2025 up to July 2025.*

All of our Year 6 children receive free swimming lessons on a Tuesday afternoon, in school time, at Dunston Leisure Centre. Children in Year 5 go swimming in the Autumn and Spring Term and Year 6 go in the Summer Term. Children have attended weekly swimming lessons with the swimming teachers and Miss Routledge (Level 2 swimming teacher) at the Leisure Centre.

Swimming Data (2024-2025 swimming lessons):

In the 2024 - 2025 Year 6 cohort, there are 60 children.

- 3 children out of the year group (5%) were unable to competently, confidently and proficiently swim 25 metres.
- All other 57 children (95%) could competently, confidently and proficiently swim 25 meters.
- 7 children out of the year group (12%) were unable to use a range of strokes effectively.
- All other 53 children out of the year group (88%) can use a range of strokes effectively.
- 8 children (13%) were unable to perform basic life-saving skills.
- All other 52 children (87%) were able to perform basic life-saving skills.

Swimming Data

Meeting National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.
