Thank you for taking the time to complete our survey. As previously stated, I value your opinion and my door is always open to listen to suggestions. We had 68 responses.

100% of you said that:

- Your child was happy at school
- Your child felt safe at school
- The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved
- You would recommend this school to another parent

98.5% said that

- Your child does well at this school
- The school has high expectations for your child
- There is a good range of subjects available
- The school supports my child's wider personal development

The question asking whether the school keeps parents informed about how well their child is doing received a positive response rate of 87%.

Parents are regularly informed about their child's progress through Parents' Evenings, end-of-year reports, and SEND review meetings where appropriate. Parents are always welcome to arrange a meeting with their child's class teacher if they would like further information or wish to discuss any concerns. Some members of staff also hold additional meetings with families throughout the year.

Only 80% of parents felt that the school makes them aware of what their child will be learning. We would like to reassure parents that our curriculum is based on the National Curriculum, which sets out the content that schools are required to teach.

Information about our curriculum, including subject-specific content and progression, is available on the school website. We provide opportunities throughout the year for parents to learn more about what their children are learning through workshops, assemblies and meetings that give termly curriculum overviews. These include Read Write Inc., SATs and Maths information sessions.

We are always looking for ways to improve communication with families. If you have suggestions about how we can better share information about what children are learning, we would very much welcome your feedback so that we can support all parents in understanding the curriculum. Responses were all very positive and I thank you for these.

I want our school to be the best it can be so want to work collaboratively with you all.

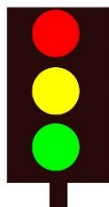
PLASTIC BAG
